

New Sharon City Council Meeting
Monday, June 2, 2008
7:00 p.m., City Hall

The New Sharon City Council met in regular session at City Hall, Monday, June 2, 2008 @ 7:00 p.m. with Mayor Ed Davis presiding. Council members present were Kenneth Ward, Lisa Munn and Larry Applegate. Dianna Klinker was absent. City employees in attendance were Diane Brand and Kevin Lamberson.

Munn made a motion to approve the consent agenda, Pickard seconded. Roll Call Vote: All ayes.

There was discussion regarding Wilma Talbert's carport. Before any decisions can be made the property lines need to be located.

Munn made a motion to approve a building permit for Ralph Munson. Pickard seconded. Roll Call Vote: All ayes.

Ward made a motion to set June 18, 2008 @ 7:05 p.m. as the date for the public hearing for the 1st reading of Ordinance Chapter 92.02 Rates for Service and Ordinance Chapter 91.06 Meter Costs. Pickard seconded. Roll Call Vote: All ayes.

The water, sewer and street report was given by Mayor Davis. One of the submersible pumps at the lagoon is not working. The cost for repairs is \$1800. Strobel is checking with the manufacturer regarding any warranty.

The Police Report was given by Chief Lamberson.

The Cemetery report was given by Applegate. Watts wants the City to sign a contract giving them exclusive rights to open and close graves. No decision was made at this time.

The Clerk's report was given by Brand. The ambulance disclaimer was read and is as follows: The New Sharon Fire Department is a provisional advanced ambulance service, equipped with a defibrillating device. Its provisional status means that because it is a volunteer department there can be no guarantee that someone qualified to use the defibrillator will be on every emergency call. Brand asked the council if the City will be carrying insurance on the new lights at the McGriff's field. Brand will contact the Little League and Amy McGriff regarding coverage.

There was discussion regarding whether businesses are responsible for making their buildings handicapped accessible. Brand will research.

There was discussion regarding a request for rock on Luzerne, south of W. Maple Street. No decision was made at this time.

After discussing a request from The Longhorn Saloon to carry \$500,000 worth of liquor liability insurance during the Spring Festival dance and the recommendation from the City's insurance company to require \$1,000,000 worth of coverage, Pickard made a motion to require The Longhorn Saloon to carry \$1,000,000 worth of liquor liability insurance. Ward seconded. Roll Call Vote: All ayes.

There being no further business to discuss, Mayor Davis adjourned the meeting at 8:30 pm.
