

New Sharon City Council Meeting
Wednesday, April 15, 2009
7:00 p.m., City Hall

The New Sharon City Council met in regular session at City Hall, Wednesday, April 15, 2009 @ 7:00 p.m. with Mayor Edwin Davis presiding. Council members present were Kenneth Ward, Zack Pickard, Lisa Munn, Larry Applegate and Dianna Klinker. Employees in attendance were Diane Brand and Kevin Lamberson. Others in attendance were Kim Kiefer, Tim Fuller and Scott Farrington.

Applegate made a motion to add a building permit application for Mitch Messerli to the agenda. Ward seconded. Roll Call Vote: All ayes.

Pickard made a motion to approve the Consent Agenda. Applegate seconded. Roll Call Vote: All ayes.

Applegate made a motion to open the public hearing for the second reading of Ordinance No. 120.7 Persons Under 21 in Licensed Premises and consideration of building permits at 7:02 p.m. Pickard seconded. Roll Call Vote: All ayes. There were no comments from the public. Applegate made a motion to pass the second reading. Klinker seconded. Roll Call Vote: All ayes. Applegate made a motion to wave the third reading of Ordinance No. 120.7. Klinker seconded. Applegate made a motion to approve building permits for Roger VanBaalen, Larry Miller and Donna Fenton. Ward seconded. Roll Call Vote: All ayes.

Pickard made a motion to close the public hearing at 7:05 p.m. Munn seconded. Roll Call Vote: All ayes.

Munn made a motion to approve building permit applications and set a public hearing date for May 4, 2009 at 7:00 p.m. for Mitch Messerli, Brad Latcham and Tim Fuller. Pickard seconded. Roll Call Vote: All ayes.

Kim Kiefer was in attendance to express her concern over the loud noise coming from Scooter's Pub and Grub. Kim left suddenly and the council discussed the noise with the Police Chief and Scott Farrington. Farrington stated that when he receives a complaint about noise, he addresses it at the time.

Farrington discussed the Spring Festival Dance with the council. He has received permission from Proline to use electricity from their building. He will be getting fence from McGriff's. The band will be set up on E. Maple Street facing west.

Munn made a motion to deny a request from Steve Long to rock the parking in front of his house. Pickard seconded. Roll Call Vote: All ayes.

The Water Report was given by Brand. Brand, Davis and Jack Pope had a conference call with Amy Bjork of Dorsey & Whitney. It is time to start the process of receiving loan money to begin the water project. The project will be completed in three phases. The bid letting will begin sometime in June. It will take two meetings to complete the process and the loan should be finalized in late June.

The Street Report was given by Davis. Kluesner Construction will be here in May to begin resurfacing some streets in town. The Depot Street Widening Project is set to begin work the third week of June.

Lamberson gave the police report.

Applegate gave the cemetery report. Tim Lindenman will also be available to mow if Walker's need help.

The Clerk's Report was given by Brand. Brand requested permission to allow Town & Country Landscaping to spray the City Park, Friendship Garden, Fire Station and East End Park. The council agreed. Ward made a motion to purchase the copyright to the Water Tower/Gazebo stained glass picture from Dragonshire, Inc. for \$300. Pickard seconded. Roll Call Vote: Ayes: Applegate, Ward, Pickard and Munn. Abstain: Klinker.

There being no further business to discuss, Davis adjourned the meeting at 8:45 p.m.
