Steve Davis was here to discuss the water superintendent vehicle making ruts on his property while reading meters. Asked if the city would be fixing them and Mayor stated that when the frost came out of the ground the city would fix and pay for the seeding.

Dennis Houser asked if the city would be selling the generator at the sewer lagoon. He was told not at this time.

Lee Bresnahan wanted to remind us about the tube by his driveway on South Pine. He feels it is not large enough for the drainage. Clay will look into it in the spring.

- B. Discussion was led by Jack Pope from Garden Engineering to summarize the water project. It is a 1.25 million dollar water project. Depending if we receive the CDBG grant, the balance will be the amount of the state revolving fund loan. This project will have approximately 8,000 feet of 6 inch transmission line from the river plant to town. It will have new filters, and retention tank moved for expansion. Installing pipes to eliminate dead ends and looping to change some 2 inch to 6 inch. Intended use plan and completed design. 95% completed on the plant portion of the plan. Lee Bresnahan asked if the quality of the water will improve and if it would be beneficial to turn service over to rural water. Jack Pope answered new filters will improve quality of water. Steve Davis asked if once improvements are complete if we would look at specs in regards to fire hydrants. Jack said would be fire hydrants as needed.
