- D. Discussion was held in regards to Pella Regional Clinic lease. Dustin and Lisa met with Bob Kroese and Lezlie Morris and they asked for a month to month lease. The numbers of patients being seen in the clinic are not as high as they had hoped. It was discussed to decrease their monthly rent to \$100.00 per month in hopes of keeping the clinic in town. Dustin will talk to Misty to prepare lease and it will be on the next agenda for the July 9th meeting to approve.
- E. Discussion was held in regards to the recycling bins at the city park. Mahaska landfill will no longer be paying for the recycling bins. Adam Eischen discussed that no one is buying the recycled goods anymore so therefore it is hard to get rid of them and make any money. The landfill is looking into contracts and they will be removing the bins as of the end of June. Lisa will put this on the website and the betterment facebook page as well as around town to alert the citizens of the change. There will be security cameras showing this area to be able to see if people are illegally dumping and leaving their recycling on the ground at the city park.
- F. Motion was made by Applegate and seconded by German to approve FY2019 contract with Stephens Memorial Animal shelter in the amount of \$4848.75.

G. Discussion was held in regards to granting an easement for utilities north of the Highland Cemetery for Jesse and Amber Linder who are purchasing the property behind this area. Dustin will talk to Misty and this will be on the next agenda to sell an easement if the city attorney agrees.
