

ORDINANCE NO. 2022-001
AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CODE OF
ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF NEW SHARON, IOWA,
BY AMENDING PROVISIONS RELATING TO PARKING

BE IT ENACTED by the City Council of the City of New Sharon, Iowa:

SECTION 1. SECTION MODIFIED. Section 69.04 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of New Sharon, Iowa, is repealed and the following adopted in lieu thereof:

69.04 ANGLE PARKING. Angle or diagonal parking is permitted only in the following locations:

(Code of Iowa, Sec. 321.361)

1. The 100 block of East Maple, on both sides.
2. The 200 block of East Maple, on the East 215 feet of the South side.
3. The 100 block of North Elm, on the South 120 feet of the East side.
4. The 100 Block of West High, on the South side.
5. The 100 Block of South Pearl, on the North 120 feet of the West side.
6. The 100 Block of East Cherry, on the West 120 feet of the South side.
7. The 300 Block of East Maple, on the West 150 feet of the South side.

All angled parking shall be off of the roadway, and be between the edge of the roadway and the sidewalk and contained entirely within the right-of-way.

SECTION 2. SECTION MODIFIED. Section 69.06 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of New Sharon, Iowa, is repealed and the following adopted in lieu thereof:

69.06 PARKING FOR CERTAIN PURPOSES ILLEGAL. No person shall park a vehicle upon public property for more than 24 hours, unless otherwise limited under the provisions of Section 69.01 of this chapter, or for any of the following principal purposes:

(Code of Iowa Sec. 321.236[1])

1. Sale. Displaying such vehicle for sale.
2. Repairing. For lubricating, repairing or for commercial washing of such vehicle except such repairs as are necessitated by an emergency.


3. Advertising. Displaying advertising.
4. Merchandise Sales. Selling merchandise from such vehicle except in a duly established market place or when so authorized or licensed under the Code of Ordinances.

SECTION 3. REPEALER. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

SECTION 4. SEVERABILITY CLAUSE. If any section, provision, or part of this ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole or any section, provision, or part thereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.

SECTION 5. WHEN EFFECTIVE. This ordinance shall be in effect from and after its final passage, approval, and publication as provided by law.
